Supporting Same Sex Attracted and Transgender Young People

What's Out There! is a tool to assist service providers access information, purchase resources or provide internet links to young people who identify as lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender (LGBT) or are questioning their sexuality and/or gender identity. Links to simple strategies and training resources on sexuality, gender identity and homophobia are also provided for people working with young people and in school communities.
