

# One Community Celebrating Diversity

## The Campaign

QAHC's 2007 Pride Campaign "One Community Celebrating Diversity" focuses upon prejudice within the LGBT community ie LGBT experiences of age, gender, HIV/AIDS, disability, age and race discrimination from other LGBT people.

QAHC conducted a survey to identify experiences of prejudice within our own community. We found;



## What did we find?

- 90% of respondents believe that discrimination & prejudice occurs within the LGBT community.
- Older people, Transgender people and Lesbians were most commonly discriminated against.
- 50% of respondents had experienced discrimination themselves.
- Most prejudice was experienced in LGBT nightclubs.

- Most frequent prejudice experienced was intentional ridicule by other members of the LGBT community, followed by a lack of visible images of diversity.
- People who experienced ridicule ignored it or talked to friends & family about it, few felt the need to access formal support services.
- 70-80% of respondents believe increased knowledge and visibility will reduce the prejudice.
